

## Healer - Family Lesson 4

**Divine Attribute:** God is Healer

**Heart Response:** Pray to him

**Memory Verse:** Psalm 103:3 “He forgives all my sin. He heals all my sickness.”

### Points of Emphasis:

1. Jesus healed many people from sin and sickness.
2. We can trust and believe that God has the power to heal.
3. We can pray to God and ask him to heal us.
4. God forgives our sin when we ask and believe.

### Memory Verse

Optional printed memory verse poster

Review the healer memory verse with your child as needed. Be sure to show your child where to find the verse in the Bible. Watch the memory verse video with your child. If you printed the memory verse poster, display it for your child to see. Practice the verse and motions with the video. Then, practice it as a family. Consider saying it in funny voices or as you stand, hop, or other fun motions.

### Bible Lesson

*\*\*Note to - the lesson is written to be read like a story. Read the bold words aloud. The words in parenthesis give direction to pause, allow for response, or read Scripture.*

Supplies:

Lesson picture – thankful leper (found on the [Kids Resource Page](#))

**We have been learning about many of the miracles Jesus performed while he lived here on earth. Jesus is able to make sick people well. God is our healer.**

**Let’s listen** (touch ears) **to another true story from the Bible about Jesus healing ten men.**

**In this Bible story, Jesus is traveling to a city called Jerusalem. Can you say “Jerusalem”?** (Allow your child to repeat.) **On his way, he comes to a small village. He could see ten men** (hold up ten fingers and count to ten) **walking toward him.**

**The men shout, “Jesus, help us!” Do you think these men need help? (Yes!) Do you think these men are in trouble like our verse says? (Yes!)**

**You are right! These men are in trouble. They have a terrible disease called leprosy. Can you say “leprosy”?** (Allow your child to repeat.)

**When someone has leprosy, they have sores or “boo-boos” all over their body** (point to different places on your body). **These sores or “boo-boos” hurt badly** (point to one spot on your body and say “ouch!”). **These men are in trouble and need help. Who do they ask for help? (Jesus!)**

**That’s right! They ask Jesus for help! Now, let’s hear what happens.**

**When Jesus looks at them, he says, “Go show yourselves to the priests.” When the men leave Jesus and start walking toward the priests, guess what happens?** (Allow time for your child to answer.)

**As the men walk, their leprosy goes away! They are healed and don't have "boo-boos" over their bodies anymore!** (Rub arms over your body as you continue.) **Jesus has healed all ten** (hold up ten fingers) **men!**

**One (hold up one finger) of the men runs (make your fingers run in front of you) back to Jesus when he sees that he is healed. This one (hold up one finger) says, "Praise God, I am healed!" The man thanks Jesus for healing him.** (Show lesson picture.)

**When Jesus sees the one man (hold up one finger), Jesus says, "Didn't I heal ten men (hold up ten fingers)? Where are the other nine? Are you the only one to come back and say, 'Thank you?'"**

**Jesus tells the man, "Stand up and go. Your faith has made you well."**

**Wow! That is an amazing story of God healing not just one (hold up one finger) man, but ten (hold up ten fingers) men! Wow! Jesus is amazing! Jesus is powerful! Let's pray to Jesus right now.**

## **Prayer**

**Lord, thank you for your Word, the Bible, that teaches us that you are our healer! Help us to remember as we grow that you are a healer of not only bodies, but also of sinful hearts. Show us our sin; help us to see how yucky it is. Show us how you are the only One who can save us from our sin and give new life. Thank You for who you are. Amen.**

## **Psalm 103:3 Coloring Sheet**

**Supplies:**

Coloring sheet (found on [Kids Resource Page](#))

crayons  
scissors  
glue

Have your child color the man. They can cut and paste the bandages from the bottom of the page to represent the man's sores or "boo-boos". While your child is coloring, consider asking them the review questions below. These questions can also be saved for conversations over dinner or while driving.

## **Review Questions**

- 1. How many lepers does the Lord meet?** (Ten.)
- 2. What do the lepers do?** (They ask the Lord to heal them.)
- 3. What does the Lord tell them to do?** (Go show themselves to the priests.)
- 4. Before they even make it all the way to the priests, something wonderful happened. What is it?** (The ten lepers were healed.)
- 5. How many lepers come back to thank Jesus?** (One.)

## **Optional Additional Activities**

### **Thankful Hearts**

Blank sheet of white paper or card stock  
Crayons  
Tape

Cut out a large heart. In the heart, have your child draw pictures of what they are thankful for. Explain that Jesus loves a thankful heart. In our Bible story, ten men are healed but only one man comes back and remembers to thank Jesus. We can be thankful that God heals not just our bodies but our hearts, too. When your child is done, help them roll their heart into a cone to look like a megaphone and tape it into place so the heart does not unroll. Your child can use their heart as a megaphone and say "thank you" to Jesus.
