



Creator - Family Lesson 2

Divine Attribute: God is Creator

Heart Response: Praise him

Memory Verse: Genesis 1:1 “In the beginning God made the heavens and the earth.”

Points of Emphasis:

1. God created everything.
2. Everything God made was good.
3. God created us in his image.

Family Worship

Optional printed memory verse poster

Open your Bible to Genesis 1:1. Show your child that this is where we find today’s verse in the Bible. Watch the memory verse video together. If you printed the memory verse poster, display it for your child to see. Practice the verse and motions with the video. Then, practice it as a family. Consider saying it in funny voices or as you stand, hop, or do other fun motions. Maybe even try making it a song!

Bible Lesson

***Note to - the lesson is written to be read like a story. Read the bold words aloud. The words in parenthesis give direction to pause, allow for response, or read Scripture.*

Supplies:

Bible

“Separating the Sky” gallon-sized bag with blue dish soap

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Last week, we learned that on day number one (hold up one finger) **God made the**

day and night (pretend to sleep as you say “night”). **And on day number two** (hold up two fingers) **God created the sky to separate the waters** (use the bag of water and draw your finger through the middle to show the waters separating).

Well, God was not finished after only two days. In the Bible, we learn that on day number three (hold up three fingers) **God said, “Let the waters below the sky flow together in one place, so dry land could appear.” And that is what happened. He made all the mountains, the rivers, the islands, and beaches.**

Then God said, “Let the land make plants that grow and trees that bear fruit.” And it was so. The land produced grass, flowers, and trees. And he saw that it was good.

Then, on day number four (point to your fingers as you count to four) **God said, “Let lights appear in the sky to separate the day from the night.” And so it happened. God made the big bright sun for the day! And, God made the moon that shines at night and the stars that twinkle, too. And God saw that it was good.**

Review the first four days of creation one more time.

- **On day number one, God made day and night.**
- **And on day number two, God made the sky to separate the waters** (use Ziploc bag to show water and sky being divided).
- **On day three, God made all the dry land and formed the seas.**
- **And God made the plants and the trees that grow on the land.**
- **On day number four, God made the sun, moon, and all the stars.**

Wow! Our God is so BIG! He is our wonderful Creator and we praise him for who he is!

Next week, we will learn more about who God is and what he made. Let's pray and thank God for who he is.

Prayer

Dear God, thank you for all you made. Thank you for the sun and the moon. Thank you for the plants and trees and land and seas. We praise you and thank you for who you are. You are Creator. Amen.

Creation Coloring Sheet

Review Questions

1. Who made dry land like the mountains and the beaches? (God.)
2. Who made the moon? (God.)
3. What light did God make for the day? (The sun.)
4. What lights did God make for the night? (The moon and the stars.)

Optional Additional Activities

Nature Walk

Take your child outside and explore your backyard. Take time to look at the grass, dirt, tree bark, leaves, and flowers. Ask your child to identify all the different things that God created. **Wow, see how the leaves from different plants and trees are all different shapes, sizes, and colors? God created all this for us because he loves us and wants us to enjoy the beautiful world! Let's see how many different pieces of creation we can find! Help your child think and talk about how God created the natural world.**
